Centennial News: Fourth Bishop Installed - On May 13, 1989, Pope John Paul II accepted the retirement of Bishop Gerard Frey who had overseen the Diocese for 16 years. Bishop Harry Flynn succeeded Bishop Frey and became the fourth bishop of the Diocese of Lafayette. Bishop Flynn, a native of the Diocese of Albany, New York, had served as Coadjutor Bishop in Lafayette for almost three years. His episcopal motto was "Come Lord Jesus" from Revelation 22:20. He served as Bishop of Lafayette until 1994 when he was appointed Coadjutor Archbishop of St. Paul and Minneapolis, Minnesota.
